EDWARD GRUBB Edward C. Grubb, 74, of Telford, passed away Sunday, February 20, 2011 in Grand View Hospital, West Rockhill Twp. He was the husband of 44 years to the late Earlene R. (Guthrie) Grubb who died in 2003. Born in Abington, he was a son of the late Edward C. and Margaret Frances (Cummins) Grubb. He was employed as a millwright with International Marine Apparatus in Philadelphia for more than 10 years prior to his retirement in 2003. In the 1970's he owned and operated The Telford Tavern for nearly 10 years. Prior to that, he was employed at the Coca-Cola Company in Philadelphia.
